If, at this initial contact, the juvenile court or Department of Juvenile Justice determines that the matter is outside of their jurisdiction due to the juvenile being detained under an adult arrest warrant; then the juvenile court or officer of the Department of Juvenile Justice shall, within twenty-four (24) hours of the initial contact, notify the office of the Chief Judge of the Ogeechee Judicial Circuit.
